In magic rings, there are two different types of ability. The first is technical skill and the second is ability to entertain. The best performers have both abilities. They succeed as professionals because of their public image or niche industry connections.

Developing original material or routines- in today's market - does not seem to be the most important criteria for booking shows. Many library performers do the same routines as the other twelve hundred magicians in the same market. However, there is a catch. The library that is in New York has no idea that their magician is performing the exact show as the magician in Atlanta.

This gives rise to a very interesting problem. How is it possible that the majority of professionals preach about the importance of inventing original material but they perform standard effects as a generally accepted practice? The answer lies on how well they entertain the audience. Therefore, the age-old question of which is most important, Technique or Performance, has just been answered.

Of course, there is another catch . . . if you invent and perform original routines and are entertaining then, you rise to another level altogether. You are no longer a magician; you become a Master Magician.

Then again, a Master Magician is anyone that claims they are a master magician. Correct?

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Post Script: I hope each member is asking himself/herself, "What can I do to volunteer some time to keep the club thriving. To paraphrase a famous American, "Ask not what Ring 313 can do for you; ask what can you do for Ring 313?" Who wants to be the next President?

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<u>Meet member Ron Porter</u>

Ron Porter formed a performing arts company in 1989 called Magical Events. This company provides musicians, dancers, songwriters, variety artists, and magicians for public events and

private parties throughout southern California. Magical Events will provide all the creative, logistical, technical, and artistic talent to realize the vision of its clients. Porter is the sole owner of this company that has entertained at both indoor and outdoor events with audiences of more than 5,000 people. Magical Events' client list is a who's who in business and government in southern California and the western United States.

Porter told me that his role as a Founding Director in the development of Project Magic is the activity he is most proud of in his magic career. Project Magic is a program conceived by David Copperfield that utilizes magic as a therapeutic tool for patients in hospitals, group homes and rehabilitation centers around the world. Porter worked with Copperfield and a team of therapists and magicians bringing his experience as a psychologist and as a professional magician to develop the guidelines for the operation of this international program.



Since its beginnings in 1982, more than 1,000 hospitals worldwide now use magic as therapy, particularly helping to build patients' self-esteem, dexterity and cognitive skills. Project Magic magicians work alongside the medical staff to teach children (and adults) how to perform simple magic tricks to entertain themselves, their family, and friends. When individuals enduring traumatic injuries or chronic illness are able to show magic tricks to their nurses, doctors, and friends, it gives these patients a sense of accomplishment, just what they need to help them overcome their medical challenges. Patients are shown magic tricks that are specifically chosen based on the therapeutic goals for the patient, not just as a means to entertain.

Porter enjoys performing close up magic. His original "Locked Ring Routine," is Porter's signature effect. Porter had several opportunities to become a full-time performer, once at the formation of the Magic Island when Larry Jennings invited him to become one of the original house magicians. However, he opted to complete his education first. After earning his doctorate degree in psychology, Porter began the practical work to earn his license, working at a state hospital. Shortly after he earned his license, he was married and planning to start a family. Focusing on his family was more important than magic; and travelling to perform was kept to a minimum.

Ron Porter has many ideas of where magic may lead him, including the possibility of opening a "magic themed" Bed and Breakfast some day. I asked him how he wants to be viewed by audiences as he performs his favorite close up effects. His answer simply was "I want them to see me as a nice guy they want to have fun with." He went on to say, "and, I love the **SCREAM**." When an audience member is so astonished by what he or she has just experienced that all he or she can do is scream; that is evidence that Porter's magic has hit his high standard. This shy psychologist has many connections with some of the royalty of American magic. His children, Courtney, Jason and Ryan may follow him in his love for entertaining those in need of a lift in spirits and doing so in a respectful and caring fashion.

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Do you perform magic using Pastboards?



You are familiar with Kings, Queens, and Knaves! If fact, most of you play with them every day. Do you know the stories behind your favorite royalty?

Let us begin with the knaves. The Jack of Spades is a representation of **Ogier the Dane**. The Jack of Hearts is **La Hire a French warrior**. The Jack of Diamonds has a military heritage, he represents **Hector from Homer's Iliad**. While the famous Jack of Clubs represents **Lancelot** from the English fairy tale.

Onto the queens, those powerful women of mystery. The Queen of Spades is a lover, she is related to **Athena of Greek** *mythology.* The famous and popular Queen of Hearts

represents Judith from Biblical times. Joining her is the lovely Queen of Diamonds, Rachel of Biblical times. The Queen of Clubs is Argine, an anagram for Regina, Spanish for queen.

Finally, this story is not complete until we learn the heritage of the Kings. The King of Clubs follows the story of **Alexander of Macedon**. The King of Diamonds heralds from **Caesar of classic Rome**. The King of Hearts hails from France, he represents **Charlemagne**. The classy King of Spades, the most powerful of the royals, represents **King David of Biblical heritage**.

Jon Armstrong made a triumphal return to IBM Ring 313

with an evening full of new magical effects. Of course, he brought is TINY PLUNGER! What is magic without a tiny plunger? Forty-five members and guests crowded close to examine the technique and skills of master performer Jon Armstrong. Key to his success is audience management. Armstrong uses language (stage patter) to direct his audience to help him create multiple magical moments. For example, he reminded us to "*never make statements the audience can easily refute*" and to "*never ask a question that you don't know the answer*." Using powerful patter will get the audience on your side. Asking questions whose only logical answer promotes your "theory" creates magic in the minds of your audience.

Jon recommended practicing new routines in front of a video camera (shot repeatedly from different angles) instead of using a mirror. The video playback will reveal how your work looks from the audience perspective. Invest several hours of practice in front of the camera then study the images captured in video. When you see how others view you working, you can make the changes necessary to keep your audiences laughing, and loving you. Armstrong gave us homework. He suggested studying five books written by folks not known as magicians. He has discovered ideas that helps him entertain so audiences see him as a real master of legerdemain.

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Joint I.B.M. and S.A.M. Ethics Statement

The International Brotherhood of Magicians and the Society of American Magicians join in recommending that all magicians adhere to the following code of ethical conduct.

- Oppose the willful exposure to the pubic of any principles of the Art of Magic or the method employed in any magic effect or illusion.
- Display ethical behavior in the presentation of magic to the public and in our conduct as magicians, including not interfering with or jeopardizing the performance of another magician, either through personal intervention or the unauthorized use of another's creation.
- Recognize and respect the rights of the creators, inventors, authors, and owners of magic concepts, presentations, effects and literature, and their rights to have exclusive use of, or to grant permission for the use of by others of such creations.
- Discourage false and misleading statements in the advertising of effects and literature, merchandise, or actions pertaining to the magical arts.
- Discourage advertisement in magical publications for any magical apparatus, effect, literature or other materials for which the advertiser does not have commercial rights.
- Promote the humane treatment and care of livestock used in magical performances.

IBM Ring 313 expects members to adhere to the foregoing ethical principles and to educate non-members of the need to adhere to these ethical precepts.
