Magic is my Life! No, just kidding. Magic is big, but not everything.

Jim "Cardman James" Greene and Philip Henderson have been engaged in an ongoing discussion about ethics for magicians. During our conversation, Cardman recalled how he started his career as a magician. Cardman and Henderson began their magic career after age forty, unusual for most performers. Henderson was 46 years old, Cardman started at age 49. Cardman James tells his story below, pulling no punches. This is his story and he is sticking to it.

Jim Greene was working at a graduation night program with Barron Vaughn. At the time, Jim didn't know that Barron was a magician. Jim was intrigued when he noticed Barron performing a color changing knife effect for another entertainer at the graduation party. A few days later, Jim purchased a set of color changing knifes at Magic Galore and More. Jim practiced the skills to produce the effect then invited Barron Vaughn to meet him for lunch. Barron was pleased to see Jim's presentation and offered to mentor him. The world of magic opened new doors for Jim including adopting the magical appellation, Cardman James.

Infected with the magic bug, Cardman James noticed a flyer in Ken Sands magic shop announcing a lecture by Whit "Pop" Haydn at the Orange County Magic Club. Jim was warmly welcomed at OCMC by Larry Campbell (Zeezo), CeCe Lane, and EGBOK (*Everything* Going to **B**e **Ok**ay). His conversation with Pop Hayden sealed the deal. Jim applied for membership in OCMC and soon found himself in a leadership role as Vice President. Every step forward connected Greene to more magicians. Soon, he was a regular attendee at IBM Ring 96 and Ring 313. Cardman James is Sergeant-at-Arms and Assistant Newsletter editor at Ring 313. He is the current President of OCMC. Cardman James aspires to be re-elected for a third presidential term for 2014.

Jim prefers to perform close up magic. Inspired by the style of Pop Haydn, he characterizes his work as gambler magic. His stage name is "Cardman James, the Honest Charlatan." He advises his audience to avoid betting on what looks like a sure win. He tells them "don't bet on it." His theory is that he may help audiences in their real lives to avoid being cheated by a scoundrel who desires to walk away with their money. A great con man will get you to hand him your money and to feel grateful for the opportunity. Cardman has learned that a good way to explain the risk of loss is by showing his audience how easy it is for a good confidence man to relieve you of the contents of your wallet. Cardman entertains his audience using classic effects including, "fast and loose," the "shell game," and the "3-card Monte illusion." He easily proves to the audience that Cardman James wins the game every time that he wants to and only loses in order to suck victims into the game; Cardman James makes his point.

Pop Haydn, Michael van Horn, Dan McKerren, and El Ropeo to name a few of the performers who encouraged him to take the next step. These gentlemen generously offered their time and knowledge. Soon Jim Greene, as Cardman James, found the confidence and skill to entertain family, then friends, and finally paid audiences. Cardman is grateful for the support and assistance from his magical friends. Magic has helped Cardman grow out of his shell to become an entertainer.
