He began work on his own levitation ideas, and in the early 2000's, he created what would become the Magellan Master Levitation, now regarded as the greatest self-levitation in magic. In 2010, Jimmy was invited by internationally acclaimed star of magic Jeff McBride to present the Magellan Master Levitation at the World Magic Seminar in Las Vegas. Jimmy also brought his entire act, a collection of unknown, original magic pieces that nobody had ever heard of, and proceeded to shock Jeff, one original illusion after another.

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## The John Fedko Ring gives a rousing welcome to Professor Arthur Benjamin

On Tuesday, January 28, 2014, more than 80 members and friends of IBM Ring 313 welcomed Professor Arthur Benjamin, the Mathemagician. This was the largest audience our Ring has enjoyed for many years. Fortunately, many members heeded the call to bring folding chairs. Everyone was able to get a good seat.



Professor Benjamin demonstrated his mastery of mathematics and showed us that with hard work and practice we could learn to make magical mathematical miracles using basic mathematical rules. Benjamin showed how it is possible to entertain a diverse audience using mathematical principles. Our audience included children as young as ten years old who were just as fascinated by the performance as seasoned magicians. Benjamin showed a method for instantly creating a six by six magic square using easy to remember mathematical principles. His **Pièce de résistance** was watching him square a five-digit number just using his mind. He rattled off mysterious words that he used to 'store' intermediate calculations that he later retrieved to complete the calculation. He squared the number exactly in breakneck speed, making all the calculations in his head.

John Fedko, who was unable to attend due to his illness, sent his special greetings to the members and Professor Benjamin. Fedko was a mathematician and engineer in an earlier career. He was eager to meet Professor Benjamin to learn more methods of using mathematics to entertain. Fedko has used mathematics to develop his magical effects and urged the members to learn as much as possible from Professor Benjamin. Benjamin presented his newest publication as a gift to John Fedko to acknowledge Fedko's love of the art.

Benjamin received a rousing applause as he concluded his presentation. He sold all the products he brought with him and took mail orders so everyone was able to purchase at the sales price for Ring 313. The Professor remained to answer individual questions. Later, I observed him engaged in a spirited conversation with FISM winner Gregory Wilson. 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#### What is Magic?

I often hear magicians refer to the magical effects they perform as "tricks." This word gets on my raw nerves. To call what you do a trick is demeaning to the time and effort a magician dedicated to perfect the performance of an effect. A magician who calls his work a **Trick** is telling the audience that he/she is going to fool the audience. On the other hand, a magician who calls his work an **Illusionary Effect** is telling the audience that he/she has practiced the art of magic and is prepared to entertain the audience by respecting the intelligence and dignity of the audience members. Tricksters want to fool their audience; magicians want to entertain the audience using practiced magical methods.

There are few truly original effects in magic; most new effects are merely new methods of creating classic magic effects. In a magic illusion one or more of these events occurs.

- (1) one object transforms into another;
- (2) an object is destroyed then restored;
- (3) an object moves from one place to another;
- (4) an object appears from an unexpected location;
- (5) an object is no longer where it appeared to be an instant before;
- (6) a performer reveals private information that the spectator suspects could not have been known;
- (7) an object moves without explanation;
- (8) an event occurs that defies the laws of physics as is commonly understood;
- (9) or an object (or body part) penetrates (or is penetrated) by a solid object without changing either object.

When you are practicing a new sleight, or a new apparatus, you are doing the same as a violinist who is practicing his skills with his musical instrument. A novice violinist does not require a Stradivarius. In his hands, such an instrument would sound dull and lifeless. On the other hand, the Concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra can produce magical sounds with the inimitable Stradivarius instrument. Becoming an outstanding musician or magician requires dedicated practice with live audiences. A musician who merely practices in a soundproof room has no idea what the music sounds like in a symphonic auditorium. A magician who practices only in front of a mirror will not be ready for a live audience.

Practice your magical art in the worst situations you can imagine. Street performers, bar magicians, and children's magicians perform in the most challenging environments for the art of magic. However, it is in these difficult venues that one becomes an outstanding magician. You want to make as many mistakes as possible in these public venues. This is where you will develop into a professional performer.

The audience members will teach you those aspects of your performance that works for them. You will see them respond just as you expected when you do it correctly. They will also show you where you have angle problems or confused them instead of entertained them. These rowdy audiences will interrupt you when they are bored. They will walk away if you are not entertaining. Becoming a magician is hard work. When you are able to cause the most unlikely audience member to laugh or scream with astonishment, then you are beginning to master the art of magic. In the words of our member Ron Porter . . . **Work for the scream!**

Some of the performers will be practicing effects familiar to you. Other performers are working on original effects inspired by classic magic performances.

Practicing for live audiences is the best way to discover how to make your magic ready for prime time. Practicing in front of a mirror will not help you with a live audience. When I started taking tennis lessons, I asked my coach if it was okay to practice with dead balls. He told me that it was okay to practice with dead balls if I planned to play tennis with dead balls. Likewise, if you practice in front of a mirror, that is great if your audience is a mirror.

If you plan to show your magic to live audiences, then that is where you must practice. Live audiences may heckle, may look away, they may have an angle that reveals a method, or may be confused with your presentation. Until you perform in front of a live audience, these problems will nag your presentation. These eager magicians want to accelerate their learning curve. They want to make many mistakes so they will learn which aspects of their effects are working for them.
