PAST EVENTS

Our meeting began with a solemn ceremony to honor Bob Alston, who passed away on December 21, 2009. Kevin Brown performed the Broken Wand ceremony in Bob's memory. Bob was a long-time active member in the Ring, we will miss his kindness and gentle way.

After a moment of silence, President Brown invited Ring Founder, John Fedko, to swear in the officers for the Ring for 2010. Taking the oath of office were: Kevin Brown, President; Kent Kwan, Vice-President; Gary Meier, Treasurer; Philip Henderson, Secretary; Annie Young, Sergeant At Arms, Newsletter Editor and Junior's Program Leader; Dave Peltier, Raffle Coordinator; Cathy Fedko, Librar-

ian, and Todd Reis, Immediate Past President, and Member of the Board of Directors.

President Kevin Brown told the members that our invited guest lecturer, Paul Green, was unable to join us this evening due to a bout with the flu. However, on short notice, Brown was able to find a replacement, comedy magician Tom Ogden. Ogden studied with our founder, John Fedko, forty years ago in Pennsylvania and one of our members was a student of Tom Ogden twenty years ago—that is the wonderful fellowship we enjoy in the International Brotherhood.



Ogden demonstrated some of his classic routines and taught members a great little bit he called "the



Seven Penny Trick." Ogden does the Zarrow effortlessly, a result of years of good use of this move.

Ogden's lecture was as much about how to please and work with your audience as it was about how to perform some of the illusions he uses. Ogden stressed the importance of knowing when to pause to help the audience understand the trick and to gain you the applause

that you merited. One of Ogden's favorite pieces is Cards Across. He showed us how this simple trick can be turned into a ten min-

ute show. Ogden selects audience members who he believes will be lively on stage.



Ogden closed the lecture by giving us practical tips to sell our services as magicians when we receive a telephone call from a referral. The most difficult question to deal with is



when the caller asks, "How much do you charge?" As you begin to learn more about the details of the event, you can get a better idea what to charge this caller. You will want to know how many people you are to entertain, for how long a time, the precise location (your transportation time to the event and back home), the age range of the audience, what kind of consumable supplies you will need, etc., that will help you set your price. For example, for a simple event for two-hour walk around cocktail party, your fee will be different than for a four-hour Bar Mitzvah party on a cruise ship. If you have two separate prices, you must have

two separate shows and are distinctive and not interchangeable.
