

Message from the President – (sounds official, doesn't it?) The 3:00 am factor.

Perception is everything. Some performers only show effects that do not look like magic. Some will only perform big colorful illusions. Here are two perspectives about the above. ☆

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First, does the trick or effect fit the venue? If you show-up at a home to perform for a birthday party, parents always offer to help bring your equipment in but, you have a 52 cards and they have an expectation of bubbles, boxes and bunnies. On the other hand, if you're at an upscale corporate luncheon and try to perform an illusion by pushing tables to the side, that's also non-fit. RenFair performers

use a lot of wood but shun shiny aluminum props. Eventually we see vaudeville acts brought back to life with the acts dressed differently, new music and the props made in that decade's style.

Back to my 3:00 am theory. No matter what style or what venue the show is in, my first job is to entertain but, I engineer the routines so my audience cannot reconstruct my methods. The strategy is to be at least three steps ahead of the audience. It's not enough to "pull one over" just for the quick "I got ya!". That only makes people say, "The hand is quicker than the ear." The 3:00 am theory also relates how flashy your sleights are in the context of the venue. When performing flashy sleights in a close-up show, you forfeit the title of magician and instead become a finger-flicker. When you perform close-up, some people wake up at 3:00 am thinking, "I don't know exactly what he did, but he was fast with his hands so, I must have blinked . . . and that's how he got my card in his wallet." When that happens, the spectator assumes your only talent is being slick.

A long-lasting impression is lost for this spectator. He dismisses you. He believes he figured out what you did. Wouldn't it be better to avoid flashy flourishes and instead slowly and deliberately, place the chosen card in the deck? Then, when they wake up at 3:00 am they can't dismiss what they saw, "I saw him place my card in the deck. I watched it go all the way in. How did it get in his wallet?" Then you'll receive credit for talent. The impression the audience makes is that you are a magician who entertained, and left no secrets behind.

Magic that still works at 3:00 am! That's how **Phil Van Tee** and **ALFONSO** perform. It's also the kind of magic we will see when **Jon Armstrong** visits the ring on April 24, 2012.

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LFONSO SPEAKS at IBM **RING 313!**

More than fifty members and guests jammed in the meeting room for an outstanding lecture/performance by the magician known by one name ALFONSO! A local performer who has lectured in Spain and Japan, this was his first lecture in Southern California. We are grateful to be his first choice in his hometown. Thank you ALFONSO for an insightful lecture covering close-up magic. Alfonso presented a diverse range of magical illusions suitable for walk around and close up performers. Alfonso showed us why he is often called to fill in at the Magic Castle when they need a professional to cover for an emergency opening. He is good!

Always the performer, his sleights are subtle and well crafted to produce miracles for his audience. Alfonso was trained to perform by the likes of Larry Jennings and The Professor, you can be certain that Alfonso is an entertainer first, who uses magical effects to please his audience. Alfonso revealed secrets to perform commercial magic, practicing doable sleights where all the effects fit in his coat pockets without bulging and spoiling the look of his suit. Alfonso was elegantly dressed yet was comfortable in suit and tie. His easy and friendly manner made you forget that he was a magician; instead, he was more like a good friend who was showing you illusions as part of his natural way of being. Alfonso's moves were full of grace, every movement choreographed to make the sleights easy and effective. His shuttle move with a coin was diabolical. Even when you knew what was coming you could not see it, timing and practice makes it work.

SPECIAL NOTICE ABOUT PLAYING CARD WORKSHOP on March 27, 2012

In the spring of 2011, our Ring presented a playing card workshop that gave every member something special. Some members learned new methods for card sleights; others learned how to use playing cards to perform good magic without sleights. Playing cards are a versatile tool for a magician. Your friends and neighbors expect magicians to be able to present card tricks. You can easily carry several decks of cards set up for a favorite trick no matter where you go. Great magical effects often do not require "finger flicking" and still produce magical responses to lay audiences. In short, there is every reason for each member of Ring 313 to be able to perform great magic just using the pasteboards.



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If you have a favorite sleight, effect, method, or handling that gets

great response from audiences, please bring them to our meeting to share. If you have an improvement to a commonly used move, bring that to our meeting to see if it works in front of magicians. If you are afraid to use cards because your hands are all thumbs or your fingers have lost their ability to handle cards, we will have something just for you. Imagine a trick when the magician never touches the deck. Henderson will be demonstrating Harry Lorayne's "Lazy Man's Card Trick." No sleights required.

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We will discuss the history of the playing cards we use. The Court Cards possess an interesting background. Do you know which King is called the "Suicide King?" Do you know how he got that nickname? Which King shows only one eye? Traditionally, the Court Cards are related to former royalty of old. Do you know their lineage? The playing cards we are used to using derived from a deck from which country (England, France, or China)? This is a trick question, answer it carefully.

If you have a favorite deck of cards that you enjoy because of the

look of the faces or the backs, please bring them. If you have special prepared decks that help you produce miracles, please bring them even if you are not clear how to use them. You may discover that another member is familiar with the special deck and can demonstrate how to make miracles. You might have a special deck of cards that commemorates a special event or location. I have a set of **Shakespeare** cards that have characters from his plays as Court faces. Many playing card decks from Spain, France, Italy, Germany, and Japan have special looks to them. Please bring any cards in your collection that might be magical just to look at them.

What playing card is your favorite choice for magic? Many performers choose Bicycle Playing cards because they are widely used by the public. The late **Jerry Andrus** used Bridge Sized cards, they are slightly smaller than the standard Poker sized deck. I was surprised that Andrus used the smaller deck because he had huge hands. I asked him why he used the smaller deck, he simply told me that he liked them. Many professionals order custom playing cards. The performer chooses what he/she wants on the deck. I will bring a deck that "The Duchess of Deception . . . Joycee Beck" uses in her act. The backs of her decks features her photographic image. What characteristics caused you to choose your favorite deck? Some decks have a slightly wider edge on the left or right side, a magician can use this to his/her advantage. For performers, all they require is a "slight edge" on the audience.
