Dennis Forel, master balloon artist, is a lung man. He uses his diaphragm to inflate his balloons almost instantly. He uses a few less than one hundred balloons for each performance. Forel uses balloons to



create wonder. He "is not a balloon bending machine, he is an entertainer who uses balloons." Dennis has more

than 100 animals in his repertoire, including a miniature teddy bear riding a tricycle, all made with one balloon. Forel began his career making magic with balloons on March 15, 1975. He has been studying and perfecting the craft of using balloons to entertain audiences ever since. It is a pleasure to see a magician comfortable with his artistry and thoroughly enjoying shar-

ing good times with his audience.

Forel is able to improve the quality of his performances and to understand what parts work best for different audiences by observing the audience during his performances. Magicians who fail to learn from their audiences, ultimately fail as performers. Forel said that the "critical eye of the audience tells him whether he is successful." If the audience recognizes his creation, then he did his job—if they say it looks more like a dog than a horse, then he has more work to do.

Prominent in Forel's work were the stories he told. The stories last the same length of time it takes to create the balloon animals. Dennis Forel was impressive with his patter, simple and direct moves, graceful temperament, and power to command the audience. We were delighted with his lecture. No animals were harmed during his performance and the juniors selected souvenirs from the samples.
