The MagicSmith returns Home

President Chris

Wynkoop introduced our evening's lecturer Mr. Chris Smith, known to many as "The Magic Smith." Chris was a founding member of Ring 313. In addition, in 1998 he became the second person to serve as president of the Ring. Chris's lecture focused on how he begins with a kernel of an idea and develops that idea into a product in the MagicSmith line. Typically, Smith produces two new items annually. When asked how long it takes to bring an idea to production, Smith replied that he has dozens of ideas in his files. His ideas begin with the effect without concern about a method. When he feels like he has a great effect, his next step is to develop a method to produce the effect. Smith stressed that one must focus on the effect first. When he has a great idea for an effect, it is relatively easy to create a method. He will experiment discovering several options that produce his desired effect. Next, he simplifies the methods until he has one method that is reliable that can be produced commercially.

Commercial production is important for the MagicSmith. He wants his fellow prestidigitators to be eager to use his effects. Smith then begins to source vendors who can produce the plastic, wood, fabric, metal, or electrical components required for the effect. He wants to offer a quality product that will serve the interests of professional and amateur magicians. MagicSmith designs effects that amateur performers can use to entertain friends, family and even *ad hoc* for strangers. When a stranger discovers that you are a magician, Chris Smith wants you to be able to pull a MagicSmith effect out of your pocket so you can instantly produce a magical effect. He wants his products to be durable, easy to maintain, and within the ability of a wide-range of performers. For example, he engineers his effects so they are made with high quality components that will not break when used as they are intended. When a method uses a battery cell, he engineers the piece so that the batteries can be purchased at any convenience store and can be replaced using simple tools. Many items are engineered so that a professional can use the item hundreds of times a year without having to replace batteries or other devices.

About one-third of the members present have purchased from the MagicSmith; members were particularly eager to see his new line of effects. Chris Smith got the magic bug early in life. While he enjoys performing for audiences, it is clear that he has found his dream occupation in magic. He gets great pleasure from watching other performers using his effects. His passion for making quality magical effects is evident as he demonstrated more than twenty effects available from Magic Smith.
