July 30, 2013 is a member performance night. Please bring a favorite illusion that always gets great response. We are particularly encouraging IMPROMPTU effects that you perform with whatever you find around you. Effects with straws, cocktail napkins, coins or currency, playing cards, metal or plastic cutlery, sugar packets, you get the idea, everyday objects.

We become so used to handling these cards that we do not always pay attention to the details. Recently we were honored to host card magician Richard Turner. Turner demonstrated how his subtle handling of the pasteboards created a virtual symphony. At our May meeting we traded knowledge of various methods to produce powerful magican effects with a common deck of cards.

Have you ever wondered if the Court cards featuring likenesses of Kings, Queens, and Knights actually had a name? If you visit Wikipedia's page on playing cards you will find names associated with each card. In some cases you will see the likely origin of the name. Some cards are linked to men or women from history, mythology, or Bible history. Do you have a favorite Court Card? I am a fan of the King of Hearts.

May 2013 Ring Report for IBM Ring 313 The John Fedko Ring meets at 7:00 pm on the final Tuesday of each month at the Community Meeting Room of the Irvine Ranch Water District located at 15500 Sand Canvon Drive in Irvine, California. Chris Wynkoop, Ring President, welcomed more than 40 members and guests to our May meeting. This meeting started at 6:00 pm when the first members arrived to our meeting place. The evening featured members sharing pasteboard sleights and effects. Four tables were set up

led by members demonstrating and teaching favorite ways to make magic effects with a deck of playing cards. Todd Reis, Michael van Horn, Ron Porter, and Bill Pearce got everything started demonstrating and teaching the secrets of a variety of common sleights. We practiced the Elmsley Count, Second-dealing, the Mercury card fold, and many other methods. We enjoyed a boisterous, fun-filled evening sharing sleights and effects that entertain and delight friends, family, and audiences. Whenever someone discovers you are a magician, they expect you to perform a magic trick. It is easy enough to carry a deck of playing cards or a packet trick to produce a guick magic show. For the magicians of Ring 313, this was a delightful evening filled with good friendship in the practice of magic.

The June 25, 2013 meeting of Ring 313 will feature a lecture by a club favorite, Mr. Jay Scott Berry. This will be his third visit to show us his brand of entertainment. We are eager to see what he brings new this time. Ring 313 is joining with the Orange County Magic Club and IBM Ring 96 to host a July 13, 2013 Magician's Picnic Party on the grounds of a local elementary school. We expect 80 or more to attend this annual event. In addition to great food prepared by the members, we will have live entertainment on the stage. Invited guests will include a dozen or more elementary school children and their parents from the local school for deaf children. The Junior Magicians will perform a special show just for these honored guests. Member Todd Reis will grill the burgers, dogs, and chicken to supplement the wonderful desserts, salads and side dishes brought my magician's families. Larry Campbell, aka Zeezo, will entertain guests making magical balloon animals for children of every age. On July 20, 2013, the Orange County California annual Fair will host a Day of Magic at the Fair. Ring 313 and the Orange County Magic Club will co-host a magic contest for Junior Magicians in the Fair's Fun Zone, a large tent set up to entertain the youngest visitors to the Fair. The contestants and audience members will be invited to participate in hands on learning of easy magic tricks. We will teach popular tricks with playing cards, money, ropes, and rings.

At our July 30, 2013 meeting, Ring members will again take center stage. We are asking members to perform some of their favorite Impromptu magic effects. We are eager to see how members take advantage of common items found in restaurants, offices, and homes. Suppose you left home without a deck of playing cards. You might find yourself surrounded with items that can be used to create a magical miracle. Many impromptu effects only require everyday items such as a packet of sugar, a paper clip, rubber bands, drinking glasses, straws, cups and balls, spoons, marbles, number 2 pencils, napkins, handkerchiefs, etc. Of course, the impromptu effect can be enhanced if the magician brings along a few inconspicuous props such as a thumb tip and invisible thread.
