Maestro John Carney delights a packed audience

On Tuesday, August 26, 2014, more than sixty-five members and guests filled a standing room only lecture by John Carney. Most members had come expecting to hear the magical thoughts of Mr. Mysto. At the last moment Mysto was called to perform a miracle in the Bermuda Triangle. However, he coaxed John Carney to fill in for him. Carney's magical lecture was sublime and wonderful.

Carney urged magicians to think, experiment, and practice to ensure that they get a little bit better every week. He urged us to simplify our performances. He learned how

important simplification is to magicians from his work with The Professor, Dai Vernon. When we simplify our work we improve the effect for our audiences and we eliminate unnecessary moves that invite errors. Carney has gotten some of his best effects because he did not stop with the first idea. He kept thinking and experimenting until he had several ideas that he could compare with each other. Keeping yourself open to improving your performance requires experimentation. Simplifying is hard work.

Often young performers focus on perfecting the newest "method." When the method is better than the effect, then the performer has lost his/her way. Low tech methods often are more reliable than some modern ideas. Audiences do not care about vour method, they are entertained by who you are. Carney suggested that a great deal of improvement occurs just by slowing down the performance. This slower pace gives the audience time to enjoy your effects. Some performers are so quick that the audience misses the magical moment. Carney learned from Michael Skinner that every trick should have a "magic moment."

EDITORIAL Where are the Magicians?

IBM Ring 313 is enjoying another great year of activities with lectures, picnics, junior contests, raffles, and good fellowship. Your leadership team is honored to provide the energy and work required to keep the Ring in first class

shape. Nonetheless, our Ring, and every magic club in our area, is facing a crisis. When I joined IBM in 1997, I was only fifty years old. Today, I am still one of the younger members of the Ring. Our members are retiring, dying, moving out of the area, and declining to step forward to lead the Ring in the year 2015 and beyond. The cure for our illness is a youth movement.

An infusion of young blood in the Ring will feel uncomfortable at first because youth has its own way of preserving, studying, honoring, and enjoying the art of magic. They bring ideas that jar our sense of what is right. They will ask questions that will make us feel uncomfortable. They will want to participate in events that are unfamiliar to magicians who have honed their artistic magic for five decades and longer. Nonetheless, these young people are the future of magic. We will benefit by embracing them, welcoming them into the John Fedko Ring.

We must work with the Orange County Magic Club, IBM Ring 96 and every other local magic organization to encourage young men and women to become active in our magician's clubs. I have served as secretary since 2006; before 2006, I served as treasurer for four years. I am still eager to serve the Ring in every way that I can. However, I think it is time for someone else to step up to the plate. Instead of one person doing many tasks, we are better served if many folks are ready to fill in the empty spaces. I was unable to produce a separate July edition of Legerdemain Digest because of my work at the 2014 Orange County Fair. Wouldn't it be great if my understudy (or partner) had stepped in to produce that edition?

We need more leaders for IBM Ring 313. We need young leaders who will remain with the club for decades to come. Unless we develop a youth movement, the John Fedko Ring will not endure. Teenage magicians are using the Internet to communicate with each other and to learn how to be a magician. Learning how to connect to them on their turf then inviting them to join us live with an entertaining evening of magic is the key to our legacy.

Each of us has a role we can play to ensure the future of the John Fedko Ring. Some of us know young magicians we can invite to join our club. We must use the most creative means we can imagine to encourage young people to participate. Long time members can serve as mentors to young magicians. Each of us learned the art of magic because a wise and talented magician took an interest in us, then taught us how to behave as a real magician. If

you have been performing for several decades and do not yet have someone who sees you as a mentor, then you are missing a wonder filled experience. Few days are more satisfying than when the protégé magician demonstrates to you his/her mastery of an effect you have been working on together.

Below are nine activities you can do to ensure the future of magic in Orange County.

Keep Magic Alive in Orange County using Nine Methods

- 1. Bring young people to the next Ring meeting, children and grandchild count too!
- 2. Tell president Chris Wynkoop that you want to volunteer to serve as a mentor to a young magician.
- 3. Tell vice-president Victor Cohn that you want to visit a local high school drama department to demonstrate magic as a performing art.
- 4. Notify treasurer Chris Wynkoop that you are prepared to donate money for scholarships for young magicians.
- 5. Call secretary Philip Henderson and sign up for a leadership position in the Ring. We will be holding elections in October, it would be great if we had at least two candidates for each position.
- 6. Contact board member Todd Reis and let him know that you want to donate magical effects that you no longer use to a young magician. Next, volunteer to help this young person perfect the performance of the effect.
- 7. You have enjoyed the performance of magic your entire life, choose a meaningful way to pass on the love you have for the art.
- 8. Let Jim Greene know that you are going to sign up to perform Magic at the Mall this holiday season. Jim Cardman Greene has arranged this event for several years at a local mall. This is a terrific opportunity to show live magic to the public and to recruit new members at the same time.
- 9. Promise yourself that you will teach several of your favorite magical effects to at least three people who are not magicians before December 31, 2014. When you teach a magic effect to a layman, he or she begins to think about becoming a magician.

There is a real MAGIC in enthusiasm. It spells the difference between mediocrity and accomplishment.

Show and Tell Show and no-Tell

Use this opportunity to dazzle your friends or to get help working out how best to present a new effect you are putting into your magical routine.

We will also practice pasteboard sleights including second dealing, the pass, back palming, false cuts, false shuffles, and other flourishes you perform just because you can! Experienced performers will coach and mentor our young performers, in method and audience control.

Do you want to know how to handle a "bad audience." The good news is that there are no bad audiences, instead there are magicians not prepared to handle some audiences. When you fail to connect with an audience then the audience turns bad. However, the truth is that Sammy Davis Jr. never had a bad audience, because he was ready for every situation.

Young performers must learn how to get the audience on their side from the moment they begin to perform whether on stage, at a party, while doing walk around, or whatever venue. Knowing how to use a heckler to your benefit because you are prepared to deal with hecklers is a essential skill for anyone desiring to perform as a magician. Magic is more than just knowing how to do magic tricks. A magician is an entertainer who employs magical effects to place smiles on the faces of his/her audience.
