Finally, they allowed me to join, mostly because I was working so often. I gave them overflow shows and they

liked the money. There are still a few Rings that exclude people, under the age of 18 from attending meetings which seems to defeat the purpose of encouraging new membership.

Weeks and months came and went and slowly other "peanut" members were admitted until the IBM as a whole realized the importance of nurturing young talent. To join IBM a new member had to prove his worthiness as a performer. You had to be unanimously voted in. It is safe to say that without the IBM and SAM promoting younger members, as well as adults who had an interest in magic, our brotherhood would still be an elitist society that equated to a good old boys club.

That brings me to the observation that there are many members, worldwide, who love magic but would never get on stage and try to make a living out of it. Some may say these people are the backbone of what we've become and the reason many clubs can now boast greater attendance. Their membership allows us to afford lecturers that other clubs cannot.

Being president doesn't impress anyone outside our Zombie sphere of influence. It's never helped me book a show. When I've told potential customers I'm the local president, they usually say *"That's nice. How much do you cost? OH... The average guy down the street costs less."* The good part about being president is that I have some influence in bringing lecturers to our club who would normally not be seen. The part I'm not too thrilled with is presiding over the Broken Wand Ceremony. Although I've only officiated a few times, it makes me remember how I liked that magician. I see my brothers (and sisters) at other clubs act the same way. It's in our nature to think that our way of performing a trick is superior to others. The truth is that when we're gone, all anyone can say is, that person thought the way we thought, acted the way we acted and loved what we loved. This month's message is written in the hopes that we will all look at what makes us similar and not what sets us apart because magicians are people too.
