Joint I.B.M. and S.A.M. Ethics Statement

The International Brotherhood of Magicians and the Society of American Magicians join in recommending that all magicians adhere to the following code of ethical conduct

Oppose the willful exposure to the public of any principles of the Art of Magic or the method employed in any magic effect or illusion.

Display ethical behavior in the presentation of magic to the public and in our conduct as magicians, including not interfering with or jeopardizing the performance of another magician, either through personal intervention, *or the unauthorized use of another's creation*.

Recognize and respect for rights of the creators, inventors, authors and owners of magic concepts, presentations, effect and literature, and their rights to have exclusive use of, or to grant permission for the use of by others of such creations.

Discourage false and misleading statements in the advertising of effects and literature merchandise or actions pertaining to the magical arts.

Discourage advertisement in magical publication for any magical apparatus, effect, literature of other materials for which the advertiser does not have commercial rights.

Promote the humane treatment and care of livestock used in magical performances.

Each organization expects its members to adhere to the foregoing ethical principles and to educate non-members to the need to adhere to these ethical precepts.

Many magicians develop an act just for children. This gives

them a path to perform at birthday parties, coming of age parties, school assemblies, and libraries. If you desire to follow this path, then you must read this article about Jim Stott's Internet presence. If magic for children is not your favorite venue, The Magic Classroom is more than just children's magic, there are forums for every kind of magic venue. Check it out. The Internet is a wide and wonderful collection of useful information, some of it is actually accurate. Let me help you find some of the magical sites.

Jim Stott started a community for magicians to share information and generally hang out together. I joined this community four years ago. I made many new magical friends. In addition, I met up with friends I had lost track of over the years. I'll let Jim Stott introduce you to the group.

"The Magic Classroom is an interactive website where members treat each other with respect and friendship. Members include magicians, clowns, escape artists, ventriloquists, jugglers, and more.

Once on the site, you will find 55 specialized groups dedicated to special interests such as busking, mentalism, the business of magic, restaurant magic, escapology, beginner's magic, and the art of presentation to name a few.

Members have contributed more than 1,200 videos showcasing their talents. In addition, you can follow blogs where members discuss particular topics."

Members receive a magical update in their email inbox once a week. In each weekly update, five members are recognized on the site (and on Facebook) as 'Featured Members' for the week. The Megical World of Dugene Burger

Thank you Maestro Eugene Burger!

On Tuesday, February 24, 2015, more than 70-members and guests were pleased and honored to enjoy a lecture by Maestro Eugene Burger. His topic for the night was "Openers and Closers." Magicians make and build their reputation with their first effect that gets the audiences hooked. Equally important is the final effect that keeps the performer on the minds of the audience for days or weeks later. Burger took us back to the start of his professional career in 1978 then quickly moved onto the effects he prefers to use today.

Burger told us if he were starting his career over there are several changes he would make to ensure more success as a magician. First, he noted that he would not answer his own



telephone for business calls. When he has an agent working for him, the agent will get potential clients excited and honored to have him perform for them. They will also pay a higher price to gain his services as an entertainer. Second, he said that he would have created a silent act. Magicians whose performance does not depend on spoken language can take their show anywhere in the world. If your work is based on the audience understanding English, then only audiences that understand your version of English will appreciate the nuances of your work.

Third, Burger told us that he has learned that all laughs are not good laughs. When



the joke is on a member of the audience, then that is a bad laugh. Fourth, he learned that his audience will have no more respect for his magic than he exhibits in his performance. The more important you make your audience feel during a performance, the more special they will think you are. Attending to the needs of the audience is what differentiates the great performers from average performers. Knowing how to perform an effect or trick is only the first step, performing so your audience remembers you as someone they enjoyed is the goal.

Burger urges us to make friends with the audience members chosen as assistants. When performing walkaround make certain that you perform to as many people

as possible. Burger wants the guests to tell the host that the magician was wonderful. If you spend too much time with only a few of the guests, then you are not doing your job. Show everyone what you do and you are likely to generate more work for yourself from one of the guests.

Burger's opening effect is quick, magical, and wins the attention of the audience. Instead of telling them you are a magician . . . SHOW THEM! When the magic happens

I noticed that Eugene Burger's solid black outfit make his costume a kind of small stage. He used the depth of the black shirt to conceal some of the methods he uses to entertain his audience. While he did not speak about costume at the lecture, he demonstrated the power of the right attire during his entire lecture. His simple but elegant costume enhanced his work. His demeanor matched the costume. He was comfortable and had easy access to hidden devices and props.

We are grateful that Maestro Eugene Burger accepted our invitation to discuss his magical ways with our members and friends. Thank you for a delightful and magical evening at the John Fedko Ring!
